# Review on unexplored Asava Arishthas of Gada Nighraha

# ABSTRACT

Gada Nigraha is very well known ancient text of Ayurveda. It acquaints us with many indispensable formulations. Many of these formulations are unfathomed. Eminently many Asava Arishtas mentioned by Acharya are very unique in their method of preparation like Gugguluvasava, Tambulasava, Kushmandasava, Gandikadronasava, Narikelasava etc. here an effort is made to accentuate these formulations with intention of carrying further exploration in this regard.

#### INTRODUCTION

Gada Nigraha is one of the ancient text of Ayurveda which is believed to be arisen around 13th century, it is believed to be one of the important authoritative writings on Ayurveda which was written by Acharya Shodhala in 13th century.

It presents most of the theoretical edifice of Ayurveda and concentrates mainly on different formulations, their preparations and indications. It is prized for its enumeration description of numerous and pharmacological formulations. Many of such formulations quoted in the text are not explored till the date.

Gada Nigraha, a noteworthy and important medieval Ayurvedic work of Shodala is composed in two distinct

parts and contains about 10,054 (2,700+7,354) verses. The first part is a collection of formulae arranged according to the several types Of pharmaceutical preparations and the second one is a comprehensive text dealing with both Nidana and Chikitsa, arranged as per the Astangas (8 major divisions) of Ayurveda. The diseases are arranged systematically, which is a new feature and their order differs from Madhava Nidana. Here an attempt is made to bring an unexplored Asava Arishtas from Gada Nigraha into limelight.

#### **MATERIALS AND METHODS**

#### Guggulvasava<sup>[1]</sup>

Guggulvasava is one of the sui generis and cryptic formulation which falls under Sandhana Kalpana. The solitary reference of Guggulvasava is quoted by Acharya Shodala in *Gada Nighraha*. Acharya has mentioned about the ingredients and few of their quantities. But the procedure of preparation of Guggulvasava is ambiguous and uncustomary. Guggulvasava is divulged exclusively by Acharya Shodala under 6<sup>th</sup> chapter named Aasva Adhikara as Bhagandare Guggulvasava. One of the anomalous features of Guggulvasa is its time of fermentation. Unlike other Asavas this one is explained to be kept for Sandhana for 6 months. Another unique attribute

of Guggulvasava is it contains Ikshu Shukta as Sandhana Dravya.

Drugs from 1 to 15 are taken in specified quantity and boiled with 1 *Drona* of *Jala* and reduced to ¼ to obtain *Kashaya*. *Kashaya* is then cooled and added with *dhataki pushpa*, cleaned jaggery, grinded *Dadimba*, *Draksha* and *Khanda* in *Dhoopit Sandhana Patra* and is mixed well.

*Ikshu Shukta* is added to *Sandhana Patra* after the formation of *Jatarasa*. It is advised to keep *Asava* for *Sandhana* for the period of 6 months.

#### Tambulasava<sup>[2]</sup>

This is another very unique *Asava* mentioned by *Acharya Shodhala*. It is mentioned as a *Shreshta Rasayana* and is indicated in *Arsh, Ashmari,* etc. Uniqueness of this *Asava* is ts ingredients. This is the only *Asava* of *Tambula* mentioned in our classics.

It is mentioned to wash Sandhana Patra with Jambu Patra Kwatha do the Dhoopan of Sandhana Patra with Agaru Aadi Sugandhita Dravya.

After *Dhoopan*, pit is made in the ground and *Patra* is placed in a pit in such a way that half of the *Patra* is under the ground.

To this *Patra Dhataki Pushpa*, *Puga*, *Khadira* are added in specified quantity.

Clean *Tambula Patras* are taken and crushed in *Khalwa Yantra*. Specified quantity of all other ingredients mentioned in above table are taken and added to *Sandhna Patra*. Every day string is done, on 3<sup>rd</sup> day *Guda* is added and it is kept for *Sandhana* after the completion of *Sandhana Asava* is filtered and stored in airtight containers.

#### Narikelasava<sup>[3]</sup>

It is yet another very interesting formulation mentioned in *Gada Nigraha*. It is unique in its method of preparation and ingredients. It is mentioned as best aphrodisiac and formulated by lord Shiva himself.

All Ingredients are taken in mentioned quantity and mixed together in *Sandhana Patra* and placed for fermentation for 1 month. After 1 month it is filtered and can be administered according to *Dosha* and *Agnibala*.

#### Gandika Drona Asava<sup>[4]</sup>

It is exclusively mentioned in *Gada Nighraha* and is unique for its method of preparation and its ingredients as it contains *Saindhava*. It is indicated *Arsha*, *Bhagandara*, *Grahani*, *Medoroga*, *Prameha*, etc.

All mentioned ingredients along with water are mixed in *Sandhana Patra* which should be smeared with *Ghrita* and fumigated with *Sugandhita Dravyas*.

It is stored for 10 nights and then filtered and stored and administered by mixing water each time.

## Kushmanda Asava<sup>[5]</sup>

Another very unique formulation from *Gada Nigraha* with an unique process of preparation. It is indicated for *Dhatukshaya*, *Mandagni*, *Grahani*, *Pliharoga*, *Raktapitta*, *Sthoulya*, etc.

All above ingredients are mixed together in *Sandhana Patra* which is then sealed and placed for 1 month in a pit made in ground.

After completion of *Sandhana* it should be filtered and administered every day in conditions mentioned above.

### Rasayana Arishta<sup>[6]</sup>

As name suggest it is indicated for *Bala Vardhana* and *Vali Palitya Nashaka*. It is said to be formulated by Ashwini Kumar.

Kashaya of drugs from 1 to 7 is prepared and cooled down and then poured in Sandhana Patra.

Then all other ingredients are mixed in the *Patra* and then it is kept for *Sandhana*.

Sandhana is done in Mrugashira, Pushya, Hasta, Rohini Nakshatra for 12 nights and then after completion of Sandhana it is filtered and used.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Gada Nigraha consists of many such unique Asava Arishtas aimed at reviving health and combating diseases. This formulations are not been explored much. By looking into the combinations of ingredients one can imagine its efficacy. An effort should be made bring these wonderful formulations in lime light by formulating these formulations and standardizing their method of preparation there after proving its efficacy by clinical trials.
